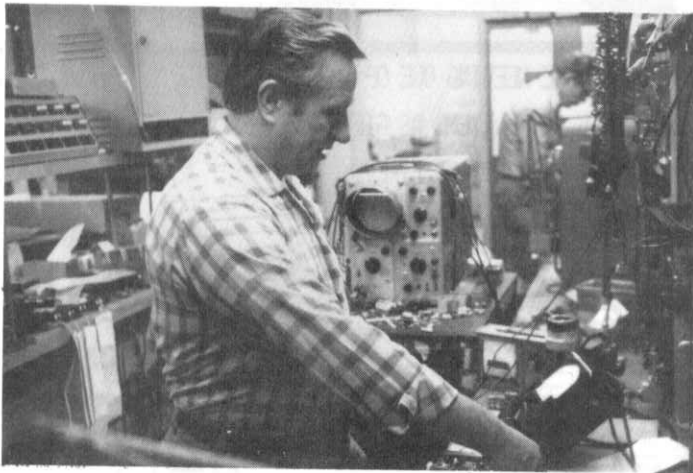

Operating under the supervision of Bobby Taylor, this particular Service Center (one of seven in the country) serves not only our local customers, but reaches out to provide mobile radio services across the country and in foreign lands.
